How the LEA will Ensure Continuity of Services?

The Riverside Elementary School District will continue to be committed to making every effort to ensure the safety, academic success, and emotional well-being of all our students by providing them with a safe brick-and-mortar environment where children can flourish. For families that are not yet comfortable with their child(ren) attending in-person instruction, we will provide a comprehensive, state-of-the-art STEM2 online curriculum that our district is well known for. We know that the best learning environment for children is in a classroom, with their teacher, surrounded by their classmates, engaged in positive and healthy activities. To this end, we will hold our mitigation plan to the highest standard in order to remain open.

**Students' Needs:** Academic Needs **Addressing Academic Student Needs** Riverside has created an online school for families who are not comfortable in sending their students to in-person instruction. All classes in the online school will be taught by appropriately certified teachers using the Google Classrooms platform. The teacher will also interact with students and parents through email and via phone calls. One-to-one technology has become part of our core instructional delivery system in all grade-levels for all content areas in an effort to be proactive should our school district need to revert to distance learning. Online ELA and math programs have been implemented to provide students with additional individualized targeted support. A math specialist has been contracted to provide our teachers with professional development on best practice instructional strategies for mathematics. The math specialist will be modeling instruction and team teaching. After school tutoring and summer school will be made available to all students. ELA and math intervention time/period(s) have been implemented daily to address learning loss. Data will be used to group students based on their reading, writing and math deficits. - (I) Coordination with State and local health officials.
- (ii) how it will ensure continuity of services, including but not limited to services to address students' academic needs and students' and staff social, emotional, mental health, and other needs, which may include student health and food services.

(b)(i) During the period of the ARP ESSER award established in section Start Printed Page 212022001(a) of the ARP Act, an LEA must regularly, but no less frequently than every six months (taking into consideration the timing of significant changes to CDC guidance on reopening schools), review and, as appropriate, revise its plan for the safe return to in-person instruction and continuity of services.
